# **Nohoval Church Christmas Carols Sunday 14 December**

Our service this evening seeks to tell, once again, the great story of Christmas, the incarnation of God in Jesus Christ, sharing in all the joys and sorrows of humanity. After two years of muted celebrations due to the Gaza war, the historic city of Bethlehem is preparing for a full and festive Christmas celebration once again. This year, the streets of Bethlehem in the occupied West Bank are filled with light and joy — decorations are up, and the Christmas tree at Manger Square near the Church of the Nativity once again shines brightly. Mayor Maher Nicola Canawati invited visitors to celebrate "peace and hope" from the "city of peace." Tourist numbers, which had plummeted due to the conflict, are finally beginning to recover, and local businesses are reopening their doors.

There is no more powerful reason to believe in the fundamental dignity and importance of each and every human being than the doctrine rooted in the final lesson at our service, which proclaims that, 'the word was made flesh', that is 'God became human'. This declares that God embraces the human condition in the fullness of its vulnerability – the same vulnerability that is cruelly exploited by those who invade, those who occupy, those who take hostages, those who torture, oppress, exploit, or abuse.

The Christmas story conveys extraordinary messages: the meaning of the word 'God' is not found in power but powerlessness; the image of God is ...... a child shivering in a barn; what brings light to the world is not the resolving of all our problems, or the ending of all our conflicts, but the belief that God can be with us and that he can still transform us, call us, to be the human beings he wishes us to be. In the northern hemisphere, this season of light in the depth of winter reminds us that the hope brought to us by the Christ child still has the power to evoke awe and wonder, excitement and delight, even in the face of terrible and terrifying suffering. We know there is a better way and we know we are called to do all that we can live it, reflecting the way Jesus himself lived in service and love.

That is why the angels sing, and why we will be made glad with our carols of praise.

Interspersed with the readings and carols, there will be four poems which seek to give a somewhat "sideways" commentary on the significance of the events we celebrate to prompt deeper thought and perhaps prayer.

I wish you a very happy and blessed Christmas, praying that you may something of the light of Christ in your own lives.

## The Bidding Prayer

We have come together as the family of God, in our Father's presence, to prepare ourselves for the great festival of Christmas. In this service we hear and receive the good news of the birth of Christ and we offer to God our thanksgiving in the joyful singing of carols.

As we gather together in the name of Christ, we pray for the world he came to save: for the Church, that it may be enabled in our generation to surrender anew to God's holy Wisdom, and bear the good news of God's love to a needy world; for the world, which is already Christ's, that all its peoples may recognize their responsibility for its future, and may be inspired by the message of Christmas to work together for the establishment of justice, freedom and peace everywhere; for all in special need, the sick, the anxious, the lonely, the fearful and the bereaved, that the peace and light of the Christchild may bring hope and healing to all who sit in darkness. This year, we continue to pray for the peoples of the Holy Land, the land over which our Lord himself walked, that they may find ways to live together in respect and harmony; we pray for the people of Ukraine and all whose nurse the wounds of warfare in Europe once again, as we do for all whose lives are torn apart by hatred and violence.

We commend all whom we love, or who have asked for our prayers, to the unfailing mercy of our heavenly Father, and say together, as Christ himself taught us:

Our Father, which art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done, in earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
